\$30,000 GRANT

Concern America ("CA") is a high impact, community-building, internationally recognized organization that brings access to healthcare for the very poor and disadvantaged villages in Mexico, Guatemala, and Columbia.


GRANTS BY AREA OF FOCUS \$1.7 Million (2010 - 2023)

YEAR IN REVIEW 2022-2023

In 2023, we grew from 114 to 126 Partners and granted \$125,000 to six impactful organizations.

In addition to Partnership growth, we hosted numerous Partner events to engage and educate our community and launched our series of NextWave events to attract and engage our under forty Partners. Our monthly events offer unique opportunities to have fun, get to know fellow Partners and learn more about and support our nonprofit family.


In addition to expanding opportunities to engage, in early 2023 we redesigned our website and created a portal to engage our Partnership.



- We aspire to achieve more sustainable leadership through Board succession planning. In 2023, we adopted a shared leadership model, adding several new Board roles and inviting our Partners to step up by joining a Grant Training Team, an Events Teams or our New Partner Mentoring Team.
